**REMINDER:** Due to the club hosting the 2006 Winners Trial (Bird dog trial) all Ranges will be closed on APRIL 8<sup>TH</sup>. CCCC hosts this Field Trial every six years. We will be running dogs in 3 fields, the normal trial field, the field behind the trap & skeet range and the field north of the pistol bays. There will be approximately 200 dogs and handles participating in these trials with the areas top bird dogs. Anyone interested in observing is invited, judging starts at 7:30 a.m.

Civilian Marksmanship Program: Our next required Civilian Marksmanship program .30-caliber shoot, is set for 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., Saturday, August 5, 2006 on the 200-yard range. Cost is \$10 per person, ammunition is included if caliber is .30-06, otherwise shooter must furnish factory rounds only; no reloads.
